

IBP Knowledge Management/Sharing Task Team Terms of Reference

In accordance with the 2011-2016 Strategic Plan, identifies The Knowledge Gateway (KG) as IBP's unique and most powerful tool. Inherent to the KG is its ability to facilitate knowledge management – or generate value from the IBP Consortium's intellectual and knowledge-based assets. Over the next five years, IBP has a strategic opportunity to further integrate this tool into the work of member organizations. Beyond the Knowledge Gateway, IBP must continue to support effective and accessible communication externally and internally. The strategic planning exercise revealed that there are knowledge, information and perception gaps between IBP members. One of the strategic objectives of the IBP five year plan is to enhance knowledge sharing that improves access to, and application of, information and resources. Three results considered critical to increasing the performance of the IBP Consortium are:

- Improved organizational infrastructure
- Improved IBP methods to facilitate the implementation of FP/RH EPs
- Improved IBP Knowledge Management Methods.

The IBP Secretariat is convening the Knowledge Management Task Team to perform the following functions:

- Provide overall vision and guidance to the IBP consortium knowledge management efforts
- Develop a knowledge management strategy
- Approve KM strategy and oversee its implementation
- Provide input, review and approve marketing materials including brochure, website, presentations, info packs and other materials that support the efficient dissemination of information about IBP to its membership, donors and stakeholders
- Work closely with the Secretariat, the RM and ME groups to develop materials to support proposals
- Represent the consortium with partners and donors
- Establish frequency of meetings and approve agenda
