

## **IBP Resource Mobilization Task Team Terms of Reference**

In accordance with the 2011-2016 Strategic Plan, perhaps one of the most highly recognized issues in IBP is its limited resources (staff and finances) and centralized resource stream (primarily from USAID). While there appears to be a level of consensus that more and diverse funding would benefit IBP, there is not yet a strategy in place that stipulates how funds would be used, how much and how to go about securing.

### **The IBP Secretariat is convening a Resource Mobilization Task Team to perform the following functions:**

- Formulate the IBP RM philosophy or principles about raising and managing money. The intent is not to have huge projects. IBP is a catalyst and we encourage partners to engage in our efforts which we believe will bring benefits to everyone participating
- Develop a resource mobilization strategy that:
  - Specifies resource requirements
  - Identifies resource availability from diverse sources (i.e., bi-lateral donors, multilateral donors, and foundations)
  - Spells out a specific method to capture the needed resources (staff and/or finances)
- Establish frequency of meetings and approve agenda
- Provide overall vision and guidance to the IBP consortium resource mobilization efforts
- Approve RM strategy and oversee its implementation
- Represent the consortium with donors and potential funders
- Work closely with the Secretariat, the KM and ME groups to develop proposals and supporting materials
